

REGULATIONS OF THE CIRCUS SCHOOL BASEL

(Effective from 01.09.2024)

This document is a translation of the original German version; in the event of any discrepancies or uncertainties, the German version shall take precedence.

PRINCIPLES FOR TRAINING OPERATIONS

- Come to training healthy.
- Maintain good hygiene during training.
- Be considerate of others.

COME TO TRAINING HEALTHY

Participants should come to training feeling healthy. After an illness, it is possible to return to training if the participant has been fever-free and visibly healthy for at least 24 hours. Training is also possible with mild symptoms, but please be considerate of others when making that decision.

HYGIENE DURING TRAINING

- **For hygiene reasons**, participants should wash their hands thoroughly with soap before and after training.
- Each participant should bring **their own labeled water bottle**. Food is not allowed in the training rooms.
- **All rooms are regularly cleaned** according to the posted cleaning checklist.
- For selected courses, participants should bring their **own towels or yoga mats** (for example, as an additional cover on top of the Circus School's mats or for wiping sweat in the summer).
- Since all jewelry, especially rings, must be removed during training, they should preferably be left at home.
- **Equipment and props** are regularly cleaned and disinfected as needed.

BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHERS

One of the principles of training and being in the Circus School Basel is mutual consideration and acceptance. Each participant should be able to immerse themselves in the class.

ORGANISATION OF THE CIRCUS SCHOOL AND THE TRAINING SESSIONS

1. TRAINING LOCATION / ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

The Zirkus Schule Basel is located in the silo on the Gundeldinger Feld in Basel. It is easily accessible on foot and by bicycle within the neighbourhood and there are parking spaces for bicycles. There is a multistorey car park within walking distance.



2. INFRASTRUCTURE / PROCEDURES

Course participants and instructors are requested to be on site punctually (max. 5 minutes before) for the start of training.

The Zirkus Schule Basel (Gundeldinger Feld) has a smaller lower training room and a larger upper training room. Access to the rooms is only granted by the instructor.

Upper Training Room

- Access via the external staircase.
- Shoes and other personal belongings (backpacks, jackets, etc.) are placed in designated areas by the internal staircase and/or on the ground floor.
- The corresponding restroom is in the changing room on the ground floor to the right, where hands should be washed before and after the training session.
- The Circus School should be exited through the main entrance on the ground floor.

Lower training room

- Enter through the door leading directly to the training room.
- Shoes and personal belongings (backpacks, jackets, etc.) are placed in the entrance area.
- The corresponding restroom is in the changing room on the ground floor to the left, where hands should be washed before and after the training session.
- The Circus School should be exited directly through the door of the training room.

Additional Notes:

For holiday courses and workshops the Circus School should be accessed and exited through the main entrance area of the Circus School Basel on the ground floor (below the Silo metal staircase).

Owing to space limitations, waiting inside the Circus School for training to begin or for other participants to arrive/leave is not possible.

Courses in the Padel Basel Hall take place in the yoga room (Binggis and Circus 1 courses) and in the main hall (ground/air acrobatics courses). The same rules apply as in the Gundeldinger Feld rooms.

Until the end of 2024, the school office is situated across from the Circus School entrance, in the office spaces of Building 3.

3. CHANGING ROOMS / RESTROOMS

Due to limited space, the Circus School Basel does not have proper changing rooms. Therefore, all participants and instructors are asked to come in appropriate clothing (including slippers or anti-slip socks) and not to change on-site.

4. ACCESSIBILITY / ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

Only those essential for operations are allowed at the Circus School Basel during course times. Access to the training rooms is not permitted for non-participants.



The restrooms are generally reserved for course participants and staff of the Circus School. In urgent cases, the use of the staff restroom is possible upon request. The restroom should be disinfected after use.

The following individuals have access to the training rooms:

- Instructors.
- Course participants (during their allotted course times).
- Staff (such as board members, office staff, and cleaning staff) and instructors from other courses if they need to perform tasks in the training rooms.
- Subtenants.
- Craftsmen and suppliers, when applicable.

Participants are required to wait outside the Circus School before and after their course times. The same rule applies to accompanying individuals (such as parents, guardians, siblings, friends, etc.). Children can be dropped off and picked up at the appropriate doors for their courses.

5. REFRESHMENTS

- The main entrance area of the Circus School, with a kitchen and coffee machine, is reserved for instructors and staff.
- Participants should bring their own labeled water bottle and refreshments if needed.
- Eating is not allowed in the training rooms.

6. PERFORMANCES DURING THE HOLIDAY COURSES / SPECTATORS

- **In the upper training room,** the number of spectators (aged 7 and older) is, due to space constraints, very limited.
- The performance may also be broadcasted live via Zoom.

 The number of allowed spectators and the access information for the live Zoom will be announced during the week.
- The entrance and exit for spectators is through the door connected to the outside staircase.
- **Parents and guardians should pick up** holiday/course participants at the main entrance area (ground floor) in front of the Circus School.
- The final day of the holiday weeks will feature **performances for children aged 7 and older**, beginning at approximately 12 p.m.
- The final day of **the Binggis holiday weeks** (for children 4.5 years and older) will offer a chance to view the course starting at 3:45 p.m., with no Zoom streaming available.

7. INSURANCE

 Insurance coverage is the responsibility of the participants or, for minors, their parents or guardians. The Circus School Basel association is not liable for accidents or theft. It is the responsibility of participants or their parents/guardians to secure adequate insurance coverage.
